NAS Pensacola prepares for a new Hangar and Instructional Facility:

Schmidt Consulting Group, Inc., alongside Bullock-Tice Associates (Architect), recently submitted construction documents for two new buildings at the Naval Air Station in Pensacola, Florida: the Navigation Training Hangar and the CSO Applied Instruction Facility. Together, the buildings total 150,000 square feet.

The Navigation Training Hangar portion of the project consists of the construction of a single story building to provide maintenance and aircraft housing to support the T-6A and T-1 aircraft and will also include Officer's offices, training areas, mission planning areas, and repair and part storage areas. In addition to the new hangar, the project also includes sun shelters for T-1 and T-6A aircraft on the South Ramp, the expansion of the Parachute Shop in existing Hangar Building 3260, and provisions for a new CALA (Combat Aircraft Loading Area) apron.

The CSO Applied Instruction Facility portion of the project includes the construction of a single story building that will contain SCIF and general classroom space, flight simulator areas, and office space.

SCG provided Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing, Communications, and Structural design services for the project.

Fire Station No. 6 prepares for a much anticipated renovation: Schmidt Consulting Group, Inc., alongside Bullock-Tice Associates (Architect), recently completed construction documents for the \$1 million renovation of the City of Pensacola's Fire Station No. 6.

The Station sustained both wind and flood damage during Hurricane Ivan (2004) and Hurricane Dennis (2005) which resulted in a severe mold problem that rendered the Station's living quarters uninhabitable. For the past year and a half, firefighters have used mobile trailers as living quarters to avoid health risks associated with the mold.

SCG and BTA provided the damage assessment of the facility to secure FEMA funding for repairs and renovations. Our firm provided Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing, Communications, Fire Protection, and Structural design services for the modifications to the Station.

The scope of work includes the demolition of one living space wing, the interior renovation of another living space wing (2,200 square feet), and its conversion to mostly non-habitable storage and equipment areas. The project also includes the addition of a new 3,540 square foot living area wing on the east side of the three lane apparatus bay. The total area of the facility upon completion of construction will be 6,917 square feet.

The project calls for the complete removal of the exterior brick veneer finish which has deteriorated over its 40-year lifespan. The new exterior finish will be a true stucco system over exterior insulation which will provide a more efficient thermal envelope for the facility. Also included in the scope of work is the addition of two, sloped metal roofing systems over the wings adjacent to the apparatus bay. One roof is to be added over an existing wing on top of an existing built-up membrane roofing system and the second is to be included in the construction of the new wing.

Construction is scheduled to begin this Fall.

Both have been extremely helpful and knowledgeable in teaching the children social skills of respect, self-control, and compassion. In addition, they have provided moral guidance by teaching the children about God's love; a lesson which we feel will allow the children to have a better quality of life.*"
